



*Line 2: sq. yd. must not be divided between lines, even in UEB context.*

*Line 3: sq. yd. is associated with a decimal value and so is included inside the code switches. The sentence punctuation is transcribed after the Nemeth Code terminator.*

- Page 3–13: *Insert this note at the top of the page:* Example 3-32 has been removed. Subsequent example numbers have not been adjusted.
- Page 3–26, Section 3.13.1.a: *Add this sentence:* This rule also applies when the expression is divided between lines.

#### **LESSON 4**

- Page 4–35, Section 4.26 (clarification) *Replace the last two sentences with the following:* When mathematical material follows a transcriber’s note, the opening Nemeth Code indicator may be placed after the closing transcriber’s note indicator only if it fits on the same line. If the switch indicator does not fit there, follow established directives regarding placement of the opening Nemeth Code indicator.

#### **LESSON 5**

- Page 5–1 (print copy only): *Correct the spelling of OPERATION in the link provided.*
- Page 5–13, Section 5.4.11.b: *Delete this sentence:* It is also used in probability notation (Lesson 13).
- Page 5–20, Section 5.6.14.b: *Delete this sentence:* It is also used in probability notation (Lesson 13).
- Braille copy only, page 65, Instructions for Exercise 5 (line 21): *Replace In sentence 36 with In sentence 35.*

#### **LESSON 6**

- Page 6–33, Section 6.14: *Insert this comment after the first two illustrative samples:* A numeric indicator is not needed for the left numeric superscript or for the left numeric subscript because the numeral is unspaced from the level indicator (i.e., the numeral is not preceded by a space).

#### **LESSON 7**

- Page 7–37 (print copy only), Example 7-40: *The phrase “is the real part of the complex number z” should be printed in italics.*

##### Example 7-40

*In a complex number of the form  $z = a + bi$ ,  $a$  is the real part of the complex number  $z$ .*

#### **LESSON 8**

- Page 8–29, Section 8.21.2 **Other Considerations:** *Replace the paragraph with the following:* (1) When transition to a new braille line is made before a sign of comparison, the effect of a level indicator used on the last symbol of the divided line is terminated just as it would be if the expression were not divided between lines. (2) When an anchor consisting of a “single letter” occurs at the end of a line, rules regarding the nonuse of the English-letter indicator still apply: no English-letter indicator is needed when a “single letter” is followed by a comparison symbol. (Review the definition of “single letter” in Lesson 3, Section 3.11.1.)
